

Sean K. Banerjee is an Assistant Professor at Clarkson University in Potsdam, New York. Prior to coming to Clarkson, Sean was a post-doctoral researcher at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where he created the first hardware synchronized multi-Kinect capture system. He received his Ph.D, M.S. and B.S. from West Virginia University in 2014, 2006 and 2004 respectively. He also holds a Graduate Certificate in Computer Forensics. His research lies at the intersection of software engineering, natural language processing and human-machine interaction. His work on task habituation in keystroke dynamics won the Best Paper Award in HASE 2011. He has published in the Journal of Information and Software Technology, Software Quality Journal, Encyclopedia of Biometrics, ISSRE, HASE, SANER, PROMISE, and ICMLA. His research has enabled industry collaborations with IBM and MedExpress.
